Receiving our Lord in the Eucharist

Holy Communion is a moment of profound faith and intimacy with Jesus Christ who is truly present-body and blood, soul and divinity-in the Eucharist.

Proper Reception of Holy Communion:

Respectful Bow

As we approach the Minister of Holy Communion, there should be a respectful bow of the head in reverence of the real presence of Christ before receiving Holy Communion.

Receiving Communion in the Hand

One Hand is on the other hand with palms raised before the Minister, ready to receive the Host.

The Host is then *immediately* and *reverently* placed in the recipient's mouth (absent of any food or gum), while facing the altar in full view of the Minister. *Holy Communion is never carried back to the recipient's pew*.

Receiving Holy Communion on the Tongue

When approaching the Minister, the recipient extends his/her tongue so that the Host can be easily placed on the tongue. Just opening the mouth slightly is not the correct way to receive Holy Communion in this manner.

After the reception of Holy Communion, we return to our seats filled with great faith, prayer and devotion, spending some sacred moments in communion with our Savior.
