FOCUS: Scripture confirms Jesus' identity as the only Begotten Son of God.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: The first reading from Acts recounts Peter explaining to the crowd that Jesus is the Messiah promised by God, sitting on David's throne. In the second reading, we are reminded that Jesus is the lamb whose *precious blood* has ransomed us from sin.
