1. To ensure the client's need and that there is a plan for their future well-being; and
2. To ensure the justifiable use of the generous, voluntary contributions made to the poor box. Checks are never made out to cash. We directly pay such entities as utility companies, landlords or pharmacies, verifying with each via bills, leases, etc. We distribute food cards to those in need. We are blessed with camaraderie as we aspire to perform charity described by Mother Teresa as, "It is Jesus in the poor that you feed, clothe, and take in."
