In Mark’s Gospel, we hear about Jesus’ encounter with a suffering sick woman who simply wants to touch his cloak. **OUR DAILY BREAD** is a St. James ministry made up of lay Catholic volunteers. Initially, we respond to phone requests to the parish. If the request is sound, 2 members visit locally face-to-face, usually in the caller’s home. Two more approvals are required:

1. To ensure the client’s need and that there is a plan for their future well-being; and
  2. To ensure the justifiable use of the generous, voluntary contributions made to the poor box.
- Checks are never made out to cash. We directly pay such entities as utility companies, landlords or pharmacies, verifying with each via bills, leases, etc. We distribute food cards to those in need. We are blessed with camaraderie as we aspire to perform charity described by Mother Teresa as, “It is Jesus in the poor that you feed, clothe, and take in.” Please pray for Our Daily Bread ministry.
