**OUR DAILY BREAD** During the 2017-2018 fiscal year, which recently ended, Saint James Parishioners again have been generous to Our Daily Bread Poor Box Ministry. As a result, Our Daily Bread members were able to visit and pray with dozens of people and families, lend a listening ear, and provide temporary financial assistance. Saint James Parishioners enabled us to distribute help with the following: for gas bills, almost \$4,000; electric bills, just over \$6,000; food cards almost \$4,000, miscellaneous needs about \$1,500; and for the category with the biggest need (housing), almost \$20,500. May the Lord Jesus bless us, heal us, and make His Face shine on us here at Saint James, throughout Red Bank, and beyond.
