ANNOUNCEMENTS FROM THE PASTOR

St James Goes Green: Perhaps over the summer you have noticed workers on our parish campus working on the roofs, etc. We are in the process of installing solar panels on the roofs of both schools. While the panels are on the school roofs, as they offer the most surface area for the panels, the entire parish benefits from the output of these panels.

In preparation for these panels, we took advantage of this opportunity to replace the old roofs on both RBC and St. James Elementary School, projects that we would have had to address with capital funds in the near future.

We expect solar to generate approx.40% of the energy needed by our parish.

Solar power systems derive clean, pure energy from the sun. Installing solar panels on our buildings helps combat greenhouse gas emissions and reduces our collective dependence on fossil fuel.

Traditional electricity is sourced from fossil fuels such as coal and natural gas. When fossil fuels are burned to produce electricity, they emit harmful gases that are the primary cause of air pollution and global warming.

Not only are fossil fuels bad for the environment, they're a finite resource. Limited availability creates a volatile market in which energy prices can skyrocket in a short period of time.

We are anticipating completion of our work by the end of September, with a targeted 'go-live' of solar, on or about October 9.
