**THE TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

**FOCUS:** Jesus teaches us that God, who is Mercy, desires our obedience in word and deed.

**LITURGY OF THE WORD:** In the first reading, Ezekiel writes of the choice of each person to turn toward or away from virtue, and toward or away from wickedness. In this way, we choose life or death. Peter's letter to the Philippians encourages us to be united in heart and mind, and to act selflessly. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the two sons - one who is initially disobedient but ultimately chooses obedience to the father, and the other son who claims obedience but does not fulfill the will of the father.
